# Music Students' Service League (MSSL)

### ! IMPORTANT UPDATE !

Dear Teachers,

This email comes to you as the latest MSSL recitals update, and a reminder of some of the rules which lately had been followed.

Please go over it and take them into consideration as you prepare your students for the next MSSL recital.s

One of the most important things we'd like to remind you of is that the original rules stipulated memorized music for all students except ensembles. The program in March however, had students who were not quite ready to play and did not memorize their pieces. <u>If the piece is not prepared well by memory, please do not sign up your student for the recital.</u>

It is also preferable if instrumentalists, especially elementary students, were accompanied on the piano, since the solo instruments such as violin, cello, flute sounds 'dry' and not very musical when played by a student without accompaniment. <u>Please make</u> <u>arrangements for piano accompaniment ahead of time</u>.

Please remind your students of the dress code (dress appropriately), and a conduct code (do not leave the recital until the end).



# MAX LEVINSON, PIANIST

Pianist Max Levinson is known as an intelligent and sensitive artist with a fearless technique. He has performed as soloist with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, St. Louis Symphony, Detroit Symphony, San Francisco Symphony, Baltimore Symphony, St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, Oregon Symphony, Indianapolis Symphony, Colorado Symphony, New World Symphony, Utah Symphony, Boston Pops, San Antonio Symphony, Louisville Symphony, Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, and National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland, and in recital at New York's Alice Tully Hall, Washington DC's Kennedy Center, London's Wigmore Hall, Zürich's Tonhalle, the Musee d'Orsay in Paris, Jordan Hall in Boston, and throughout the US, Canada, and Europe. Levinson's international career was launched when he won First Prize at the 1997 Dublin International Piano Competition, where he was also awarded a special prize for best performance of a newly commissioned work. He then received overwhelming critical acclaim for his two solo recordings on N2K Encoded Music, and was awarded the prestigious Avery Fisher Career Grant in March 1999. Most recently, he was awarded the 2005 Andrew Wolf Award in recognition of his achievements in chamber music. Max Levinson is a graduate of Harvard and the New England Conservatory, receiving an Artist Diploma and the Gunther Schuller Medal. His teachers include Patricia Zander, Aube Tzerko and Bruce Sutherland. An active chamber musician, Levinson has collaborated with such artists as Pinchas Zukerman, Richard Stoltzman, and the Tokyo, Vermeer, Mendelssohn and Borromeo Quartets, and regularly appears at major music festivals including Santa Fe, Marlboro, Tanglewood, La Jolla, and Switzerland's Davos Festival. He is Artistic Director of the San Juan Chamber Music Festival in Ouray, Colorado, and is on the faculty at Boston Conservatory and Brown University. Max Levinson lives in the Boston area with his wife, cellist Allison Eldredge, and their daughters Natalie and Jessica. www.maxlevinson.com



# **Call for "Poster Sessions"**

### At the MTAC 100<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention July 2-6, 2010 SEE BELOW FOR THE EXTENDED DEADLINE ⇒ Branch Presidents: Please include this notice in your newsletters

The MTAC Annual Convention will provide an opportunity for selected individuals to present research projects to an interested audience, using a primarily visual medium. Teachers, researchers and students wanting to present will produce a poster, up to 30" by 40" in size, which will describe the research results concisely, clearly and completely. Additionally, a one-page handout should also be available for attendees to take away with them. Time will be indicated in the MTAC Convention Program book when the Posters are to be displayed in the Convention Foyer area, generally during the lunch hour on Saturday and Sunday, with the presenter nearby to answer questions and talk with attendees.

### There are two types of Poster Presentations:

- 1. Research papers—projects that focus on a clearly articulated research question or hypothesis and a clear and appropriate methodology. Research reports dealing with any aspect of music, music teaching, music learning or related subject areas are welcome.
- 2. Student/pedagogy projects—demonstrate interesting and creative ways of teaching music skills, such as harmonization, sight playing, composition, music history, theory or any other practical information that teachers can use in their studios.

Submissions should be e-mailed to Lee Galloway, Convention Program Chair, (Lee@LeeGalloway.com). Place "MTAC Poster Sessions" in the Subject line. The deadline for submission has been extended to April 30, 2010; this deadline allows you to be listed in the Convention Program book.

# Entries <u>may</u> still be accepted up to May 31, 2010, however entries received between April 30 and May 31 cannot be listed in the Convention Program book.

Include:

- 1. A page indicating your name, contact information, and your place of research (school, university, private studio).
- 2. A one-page summary of the material and conclusions you intend to present.
- 3. A schematic graphical representation (.pdf, .doc, .jpg, or .ppt file) of the way you expect your poster to appear.

Please note:

- All posters must be no larger than 30" by 40," have hard backing, and should include all pertinent information in a manner that is visible from three to four feet away. An easel will be provided.
- 100 copies of a report abstract, limited to one sheet of paper, should be made available at the conference.
- Presenters must register for the 2010 MTAC Convention. Convention registration, travel expenses, room, poster expenses, copies, etc. are the responsibility of the presenter.
